

Encourage the children to ask questions about places they are going to visit using how, what, where.

Go on a village walk and encourage the children to talk about what they have seen. e.g. types of buildings, signs, plants and animals.



Make an obstacle course in the park or garden where the children have to run around benches or chairs, crawl under a blanket or crawl through a box.

Listen to music and practise clapping in time with the beat. Clap the syllables in their names and other words.

Look at maps and talk about their journey to school. Point out points of interest along a familiar route. Take a journey on a bus, train or boat and talk about what they can see on the journey. Let them look at the ticket and talk about what the markings mean.

Nursery Summer Term 2018 Home Learning Ideas Topic: All Aboard



Count out groups of objects from the home e.g. pasta, lego, fruit and compare quantities. Arrange the same number of objects in different ways and talk about the total staying the same.

Use non-fiction books to learn about different forms of transport. Look at the contents page, labels and photographs. Encourage the children to ask questions and use the book to find the answers.

Practise using 'birdy beak' when writing, copying letters and writing names. Encourage the children to listen to initial sounds in words and attempt to write them.

Play games involving counting out objects. Chn to go on a treasure hunt outside and find 6 leaves, 5 stones, 4 twigs etc. Match numbers to quantities or represent the numbers through drawings.

Explore technology around the home. Press buttons e.g. on a remote control, door bell, pedestrian crossing. Use the internet to find out information about different forms of transport.

Share stories and talk about the characters, events and settings. Use toys to help children make up their own stories.
